KI BOIS staff attended the IRS Oklahoma Partner Meeting on December 12th in Midwest City. KI BOIS has partnered with the IRS since December 2003 to offer free tax preparation services to qualified taxpayers.

The VITA program is an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) program designed to help low-and moderate-income taxpayers complete their annual tax returns at no cost. To carry out it's mission of free tax preparation for taxpayers who qualify, the VITA program uses trained and certified volunteers to provide the service of preparing tax returns. Founded in 1971 by Gary Iskowitz at California State University Northridge, the original

program concept was to provide local taxpayers with free tax return preparation in an effort to provide a valuable community service and a hands-on learning experience for the students. The program has grown from a small group of accounting students to a nationwide program with more than 92,000 volunteers preparing 3.2 million returns annually. Staff is already busy preparing returns. For tax-year 2024, the income threshold is \$67,000 or less.

Ardmore DD Services

KI BOIS Community Action provides Developmental Disabilities (DD) Services that includes clients in the Ardmore area of the state. KI BOIS employs Habilitation Training Specialists (HTS) and Health Care Coordinator's (HCC) assigned to each home served. The caseload in Ardmore has grown to require three Program Coordinator's (PC's) who supervise staff, schedule shifts, secure training opportunities and provide admin support.

On February 4th & 5th, Jan Garner, KI BOIS Fiscal Officer, Doylene Knowlton, KI BOIS Human Resources Director, Jodi Briggs, KI BOIS Payroll Coordinator and Shelly Davis, KI BOIS Billing Specialist traveled to Ardmore to meet with the PC's to provide training. These four ladies have a combined knowledge of over 100 years experience at KI BOIS Community Action. "We felt that it was important to visit our Ardmore operation in person and introduce ourselves, get to know the staff, and provide one -on-one training to the PC's," said Jan Garner.

On day two, the PC's accompanied them to several client homes where they were introduced to direct-care staff and the clients they serve. "It was a great opportunity to the incredible staff and clients in Ardmore," said Doylene Knowlton.
