Rx for Oklahoma... A Life-Changing Program

The KI BOIS Community Action Rx For Oklahoma program is a prescription assistance program designed to help Oklahoma residents, regardless of age, who are uninsured or underinsured. The Rx staff assists with the completion of the application and required documentation. Although KI BOIS Rx for Oklahoma cannot guarantee approval, the staff goes to great lengths to do everything possible to get the client approved through the pharmaceutical company. Below is a great story of just how important and life-changing this program has been to a local client.

In May 2024, Curtis Baker met with Stephanie McCann, Rx Outreach Worker from Wilburton, at The Eufaula Health and Wellness Center to apply for assistance with the RX for Oklahoma Program. He had been given a sample of Rinvoq from his Provider and the medication seemed to be working. Mr. Baker has Medicare with a Part D plan and his insurance would not allow the medication due to the criteria that had to be met first. Mr. Baker allowed Stephanie to appeal Humana's decision to deny the life-saving medication.

On June 5th, 2024, after a long-drawn-out process of calling the Insurance company several times and sending in what they required, Mr. Baker was finally approved his Rinvoq through Humana. After calling and giving Mr. Baker the news of his approval, Stephanie called to check the cost of his copay with the Pharmacy and it was \$3095.00 for a 27-day supply! Of course, it was devastating news. The cost was way out of what anyone could afford.

Stephanie sent the approval letter from Humana and the pharmacy co-pay cost to AbbVie.

On June 10th, 2024, AbbVie reviewed the paperwork and called Mr. Baker to let him know he was approved for Rinvoq until Dec 2024 at no cost to him. He will receive a 90-day supply at a time through December 2024. Mr. Baker is very appreciative of the lengths and time that was put into getting him this very important medication that he would not normally be able to afford.

This is just one example of how the outreach efforts and persistence of KI BOIS staff pays off. Being a long-time KI BOIS employee, Stephanie knew how to navigate the systems set forth and pursue the appeals and she was successful in connecting Mr. Baker to another company. This is a perfect example of the KI BOIS culture. We are truly "Helping People and Changing Lives!"

Mr. Baker sent an appreciation letter to Amy Fair, Rx for Oklahoma Director, and Stephanie and praised them for the work they put into helping him get his medication for free. 


The work this little community has done to restore this historical icon is amazing, especially considering the size of the community.

As you can see, KI BOIS was well represented at the event and we look forward to working with this community in the future. Its great to see what we can accomplish together!








KI BOIS Board Chairman Cecil Williams is honored for his service in the Army in Poteau. Thank you for your service to our Country and to our Board Corporal Williams.
